The Colour of Time parade will follow a set route through the park each evening, beginning near the Holy Cow Chai Tent concluding with a finale, adjacent to the Foundation Stage which will involve the throwing of coloured gulal powder. This finale occurs in a designated area and anybody who does not wish to be involved can clearly move out of the way of the processional performance – no one is forced to participate.

If you suffer from Asthma and / or have particularly sensitive or allergic skin you should avoid use of the powder and people wearing contact lenses should avoid the powder making contact with their eyes.

While the gulal powder will not stain clothes which can be cleaned by shaking the clothes and lightly brushing off any colour when dry and washing them within 24 hours in cold water, we would recommend that people avoid wearing special items of clothing.

The packets of gulal powder have safety directions printed on them as well as the washing instructions “brush off before washing clothes in cold water.”

The powder is composed of 99% Corn Starch / 1% Food Grade Dyes and is non-toxic, eco and skin friendly certified by SGS.

The performance is intended to be an exhilarating and inclusive experience for any that wish to take part and a celebration of joy and unity – and our WOMA Adelaide volunteers will be able to answer any questions you may have about The Colour of Time.
